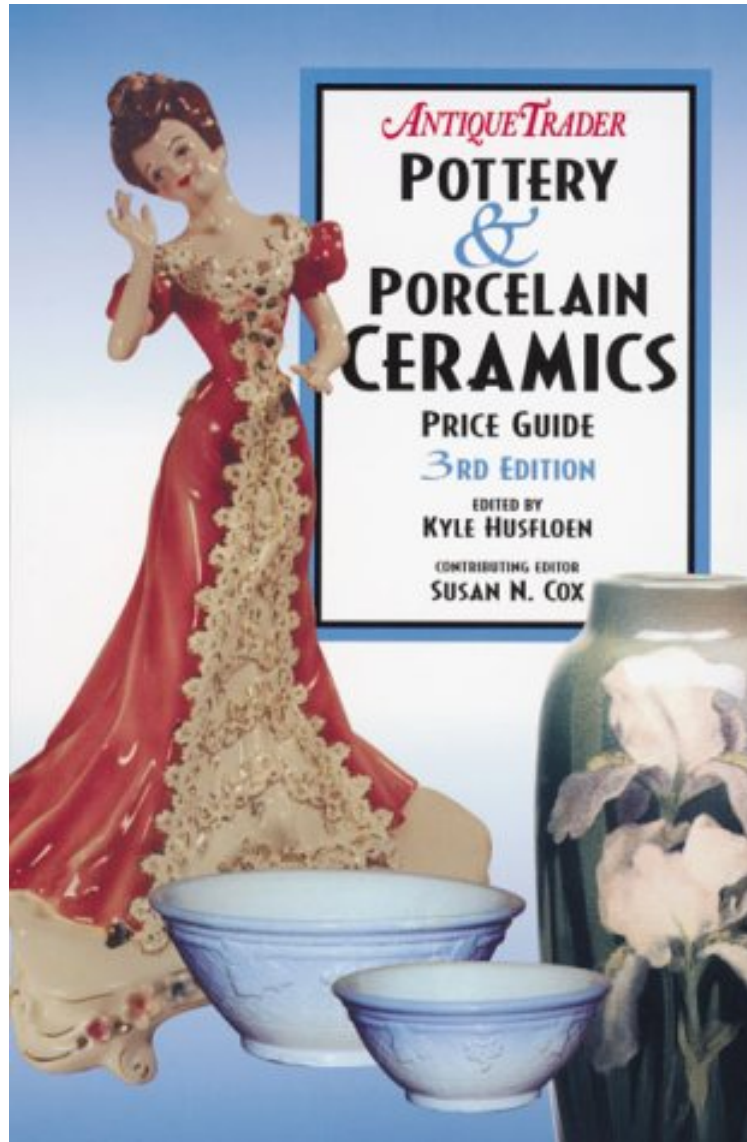

Topics range from Austrian, Doulton, Harker, to UHL, Warwick and Zsolnay. Each topic is described. The volume is an easy to use reference work. By A Customer I found this book to be very limited and incomplete. Of the dozen or so items I looked up, it had listed two. Even such categories as well documented as Royal Doulton were incomplete, leaving me guessing as to the value of my pieces. I really wouldn't recommend this to anyone.
