In this issue:Modern Navajo Weaving, by Clara Tanner. "The transition to styles with a distinctive local flavor occurred gradually and without fanfare. Some of the old styles persisted side by side with the new, a trend still apparent to this day." A noted authority traces the history of Navajo weaving from its inception three centuries ago,

then describes current work. Seven pages of text with bw illustrations and a map of rug producing areas on the Navajo reservation, followed by 8 pages of color photos of Navajo rugs. The Land Wisdom of the Indians, a chapter from Stewart Udall book `The Quiet Crisis.` Ancient Manuscripts on Ancient Stones, by William Coxon. The author, who died in August 1963, spent half a lifetime researching petroglyphs. He found many in Arizona, but this article also contains illustrations from other continents. Coxon found that many of the symbols he found along the Gila River also appeared along rivers in Ireland, the Nile in Egypt, and elsewhere. 11 pages with photos, mostly bw.
