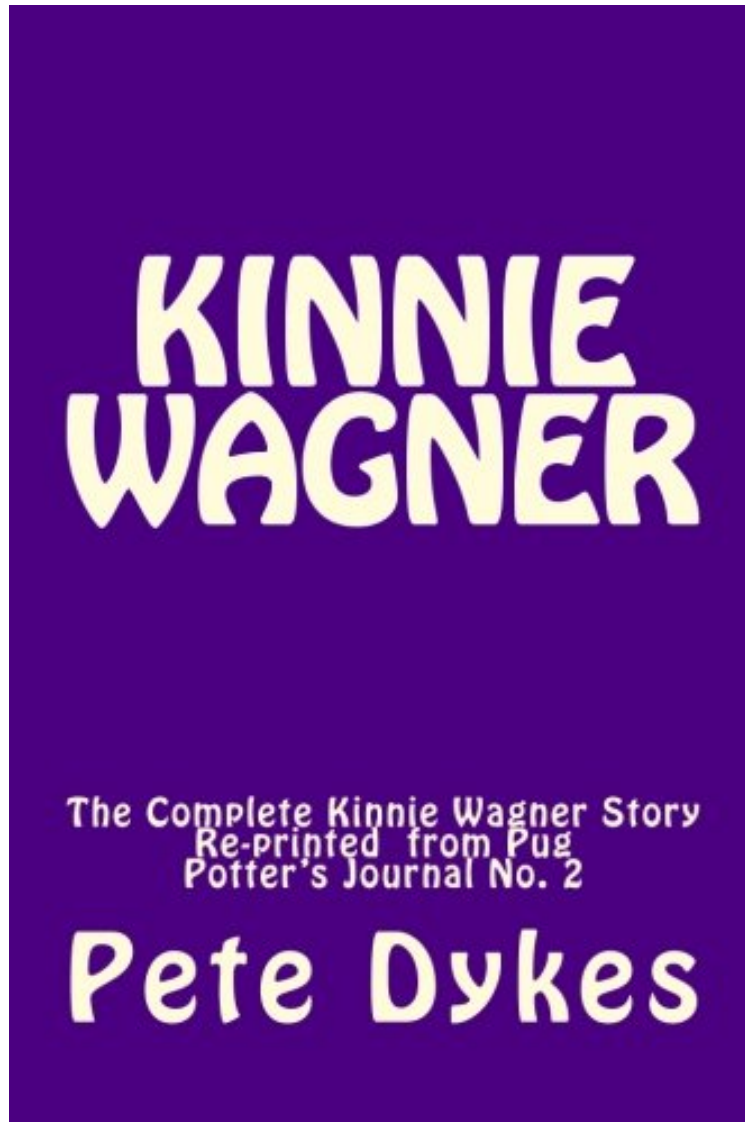

Here's the story of a notorious gunman, called the "fastest gun in the south". Following shoot-outs with officers in 1925, Kinnie Wagner, 21, became one of the most wanted men in America. To some, he was a folk hero. To others, a deadly killer. To all, he is a part of America's history and folklore. This story was originally printed as a continuing series in the Daily News of Kingsport, and was published in book form to meet demand by readers and collectors. Told largely in first person by Pug Potter, a character created especially for this purpose, the story details Wagner's troubles from his first arrest on what he claimed was a bogus charge. He managed to grab a pistol, shot the deputy sheriff who was his guard, and escaped to make his way to Kingsport, Tennessee, where five armed officers apparently attempted to collect the \$1,000. dead or alive reward being offered by the Mississippi Sheriff. In the following shoot-out, two officers died, one was severely wounded, one ran off, and one palyed dead until the young shooter grabed a horse and fled. This book contains five major parts of his story: Trouble, Trial, Verdict, Escape, and Final Escape. No Appalachian folktale collection is complete without it.

About the AuthorPete L. Dykes has been a newspaperman for 50 years, and has collected and written hundreds of stories about people and events in both Tennessee and Virginia. Many of his stories first appeared in The Daily News of Kingsport. At age 84, he continues to work and write.
