

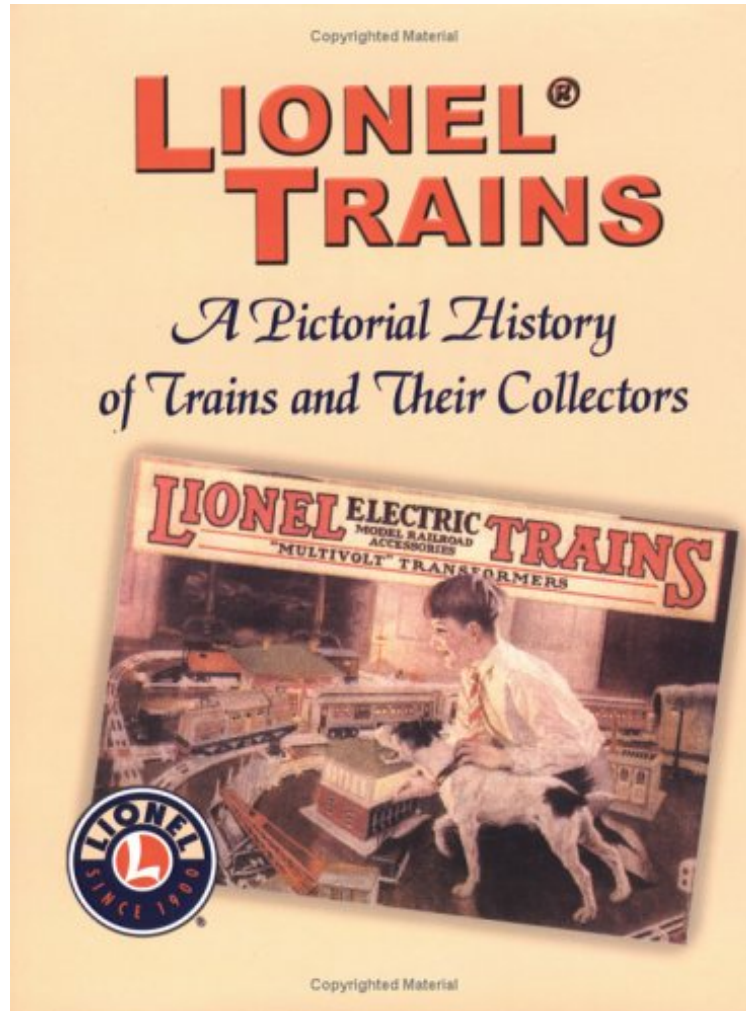

You read three of them and you get three slightly different renditions of who did what, when, and with (or to) whom. Despite the distractions caused by these seeming disagreements, the timeline is interesting. The Kughn interview is the best part of the book: a good blend of verbiage and photography. But the back of the book suffers from unimaginative expositions of what must have been answers to a questionnaire or survey given to the various collectors. They are way too formulaic, and thus end up boring. Maybe

the answers should have been presented as a table, like political candidates' answers to policy questions, and then devote more space to pictures. In a few cases, the most interesting or rarest item in a given collection was mentioned in the text, but not pictured. After reading the first dozen or so narratives, I just looked at the pictures.
