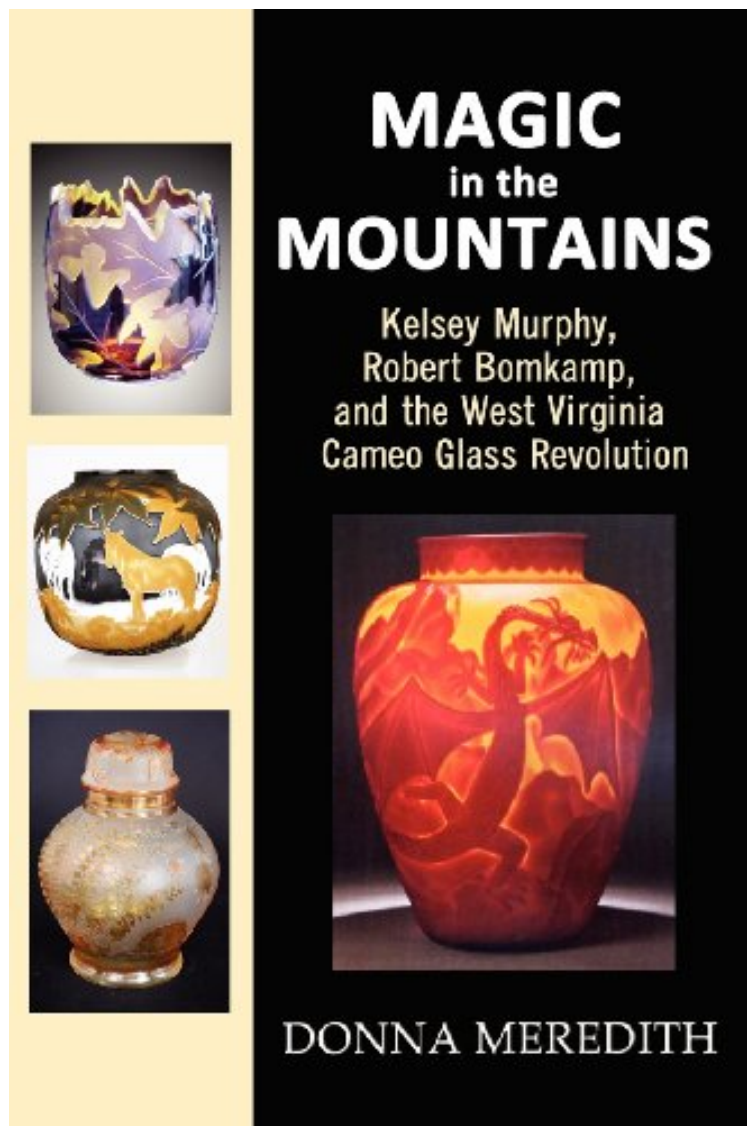

Murphy and Robert Bomkamp, that were instrumental in creating a West Virginian revolution in the art of hand blown glass. With the backing of owner and Chief Executive Officer of Pilgrim Glass, one of the foremost glass blowing "factories" in the U.S., Alfred E. Knobler committed the time, energy, talent and financial resources to enable Kelsey and Robert to create Cameo Glass. Pilgrim's highly skilled artisans blew multi-color, layered bowls and vases. Then, Kelsey and Robert created exciting art for which they then created a method to hand carve these glass 'blanks' into multi-layered Cameo works of unique art. Donna Meredith, the author, has documented a biographical portrait of Kelsey and Robert and the birth of an exceptional and unique stage in glass blowing art. While Pilgrim is no longer in business, Kelsey and Robert are still creating Cameo with blanks being blown by other glass blowing companies that are still in existence. MAGIC in the MOUNTAINS is a window into glass as an art, not merely a vessel nor a functional plate glass material for table surfaces or coverings. It is a rare art because Kelsey and Robert created, with the help of Pilgrim Glass, colorful multi-layer Cameos from 3 - 5 layers up to 12 and 13 layers of beautiful, artistic expressions.
