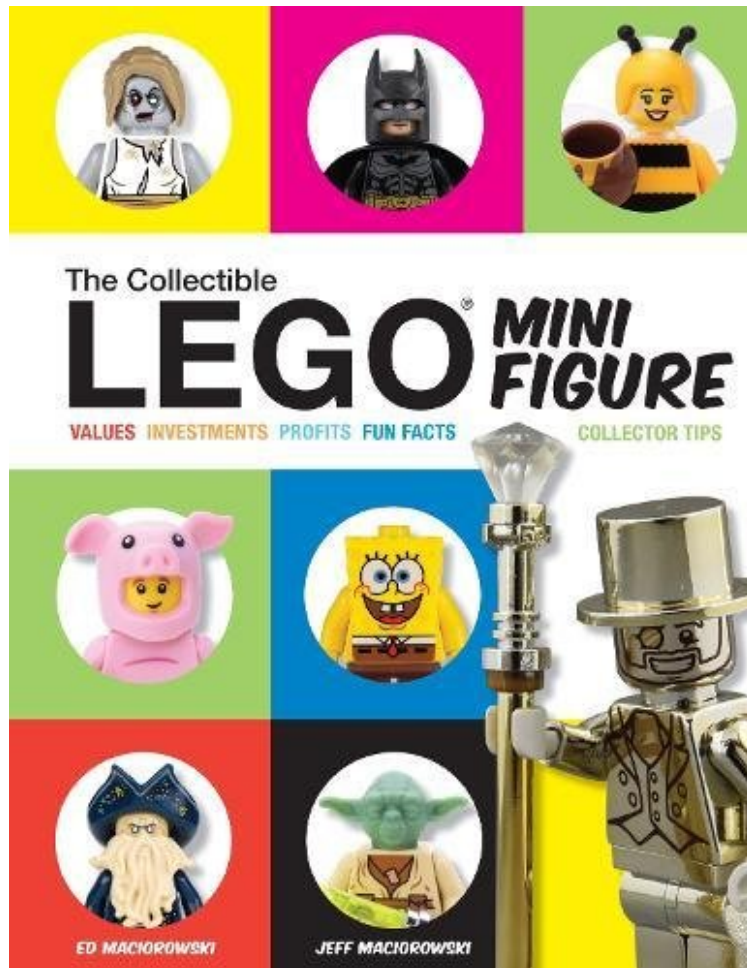

Through no fault of their own the book is more artsy, featuring clip art style art in addition to photos, and has an art style that would have more appeal to kids.
