

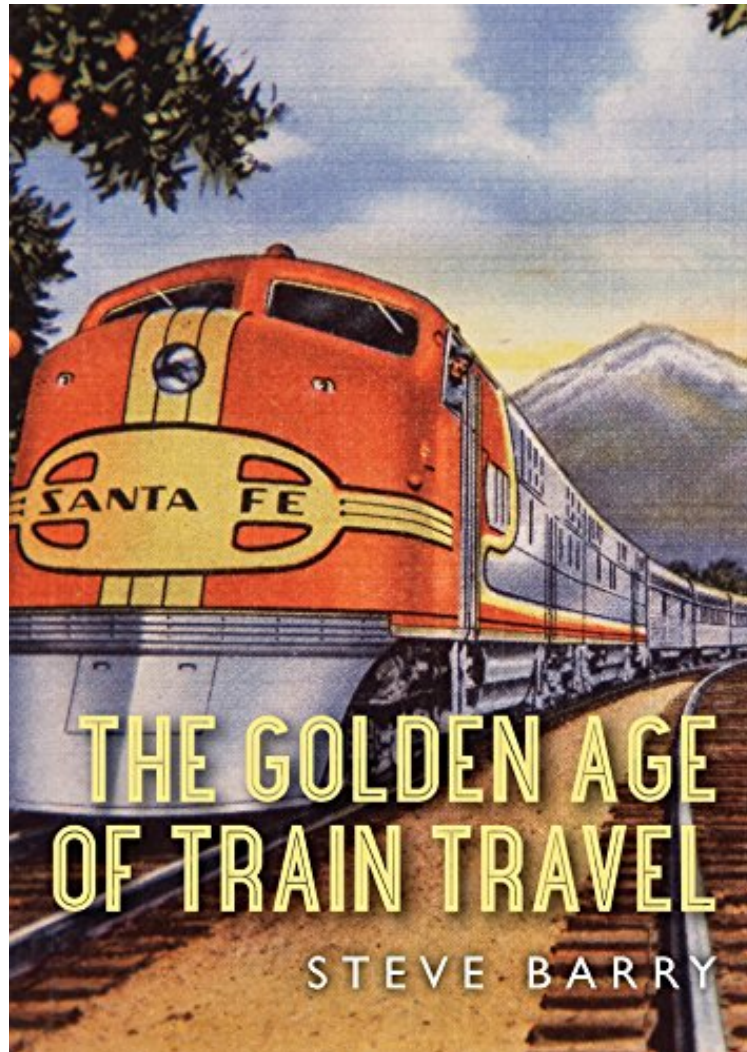

Due to the limited size, the typeface is quite small, which might be a problem considering the age group most likely to be interested in this topic. The photos are really too small to really see the charm and splendor of the passenger cars being illustrated and some of the advertising and illustrations are unreadable without a

magnifier.
